Without significant financial assistance to match financial aid offered by high schools our students cannot say "yes" to the admissions they have earned. Our goal is to raise scholarship dollars to make this possible and keep the doors open for our graduates.

Scholarship funds are essential to bridging the gap in financial aid and the cost of tuition which is far beyond the capacity of our families to afford. Your gift will help to build that bridge, making possible the opportunity of rigorous studies and a certain path to higher education.

Students who enroll at LFDCS represent the demographics of a community with serious economic, environmental and educational poverty. A two-year kindergarten program instills the readiness skills and language base to grow and excel in a rigorous standards-based curriculum through grade 8. Our eighth graders are prepared for high school admission to excellent private, independent and religious-based secondary schools with strong college preparatory programs.

Each year 100% of our eighth graders take on the challenge of applying to selective secondary schools with more than 70% earning admission to a path that will allow them to reach for their dreams and realize the full promise of their potential. With 93% of our students' families at or below the federal poverty level, our students need more than good grades and high test scores to accept admission and move forward on a surer path toward higher education and a positive future.

OPENING DOORS FOR OUR CURRENT STUDENTS

In June of each year approximately 50 students will graduate, and at least 40 students will have earned admission to selective secondary schools. Twenty-five or more graduates need \$2,000-\$4,000 for each year of high school or \$8,000-\$16,000 set aside in scholarships to ensure not only that they can enroll but also that they can remain at that school until they graduate.

An average of \$10,000 for students or \$250,000 is the real need of annual scholarships at Lawrence Family Development Charter School.
